Unofficial Minutes of the June meeting—June 19th

The meeting was called to order at 7:08 pm. 34 members attended the meeting.

Ken Zahn shared highlights of a video on Minerals at the "What's New in Munich Mineral Show".

Correspondence included letters from Jackie Edens and a thank you note from Dan Carter., a PLWA newsletter and a Helena newsletter.

Old Business: John Usher checked into Earl Stermetz' equipment. He sold the lapidary equipment. He has a large display unit still for sale for \$300. His brother also has grit for sale.

John also reported on the MT council meeting in Butte. There will be a summer newsletter that will discuss the showcases used for the Gem and Mineral shows. They will build 5 more display cases for next year. There are some LED lights missing. There will be a checklist for next year for all parts of the showcases so they are accounted for. There will be a fossil dig near Bynam, August 25-27. The council will help pay for the cost of the field trip. Stamps collected will only be the special stamps, not the Forever, everyday stamps. Officers were elected. Dick Wendell was elected president. The state council has \$8800 in their account. There was a also a report on legislative issues about access to public lands.

The Fairgrounds building was to be discussed at a meeting today. The County Attorney's office still has the application with no progress made as of yet.

New Business: We now have a web site. It is not finished, but an email will be sent to members with the link.

John will lead a trip to the Copper City mine on Sunday, July 22. Meet at Belgrade Albertson's at 9:00 am. No four wheel drive is required. Pick ax, shovel, buckets, scraping tools, rock hammer, safety glasses if you are using a rock hammer. Bring a lunch and water.

Claim #1 Field Trip

John Slay visited his brother last week in Prescott, AZ, and decided to try a few spots in Utah on the return trip. With some info and references on Utah collecting sites, and an introduction to an active collector in Salt Lake City, John drove to Delta UT and visited the 2 prominent "rock shops" there, purchasing a meteorite and some promising Dugway geodes and septarian nodules to cut and polish. He then decided to find the Topaz Cove area of the Thomas Range north of Delta, and spent a part-day there braving the blistering heat of the white rhyolite to pry out sherry-colored topaz crystals from the small vugs and seams of the "cove" area.
